Farewell to Dato' Dr K Inbasegaran

The dinner was held at the Royal Lake Club on 30 May 2003 and the attendees comprised the Director of HKL, Dr Ramlee Rahmat, heads of departments, fellow colleagues, medical officers, medical assistants, intensive care and operating theatre nurses and anaesthesiologists from the Klang Valley.
