## ORAL / POSTER PRESENTATION

Guidelines for submission of abstract for oral/poster presentation

- The entire abstract including title, author(s) and text should be confined to one A4 page and justified.
- The text should not exceed 300 words. Please use Arial 11 font for typing. Use the Microsoft Words format.
- The title of the paper should be centered and printed in bold, UPPER CASE letters. Leave two blank lines and then enter the author names.
- Leave one line and then type affiliations of author(s) following the names. Use superscript numbers to identify authors with particular institutions. A maximum of four authors can be listed. Underline the name of the author who is the presenter. Do not write degrees or professional titles.
- Leave two blank lines and then begin the body of the text. In typing the body of the abstract, please ensure that it is single-spaced and that the start of each paragraph is not indented. Each paragraph should be separated by one blank line.
- Organize the abstract body in the following manner:
  - Introduction and Objectives of the study
  - Material and methods
  - Summary of result
  - Conclusion.

### Requirements for Submission of a Poster Presentation

- Provide a forum for a one-to-one, in-depth discussion using narrative and visual material to display and communicate the objectives, methods, results, and conclusions of a specific research study or illustrate a piece of equipment, technique, program, etc.
- It is the responsibility of the presenting author to ensure accuracy of content, spelling and presentation.
- Visual material such as photographs, charts and diagrams may be used. Note: All patient photographs should be de-identified to safeguard protected health information.
- The presenting author(s) serves as the resource person for the presentation. If not in attendance, the presenting author must provide contact information as part of the presentation including telephone number and email address.
- One poster board, 80 X 100 cm and tacks for mounting will be provided for each Poster Presentation.
- A heading for the top of the poster space should be prepared indicating the title (same as that of the abstract submitted), author(s) and institutional affiliations using letters not less than 3 cm high.
- Printing on the poster should be a minimum of 2 cm high. Illustrations and printing must be readable from distances of at least 2 meters.
- Sole use of displayed typewritten pages of the paper or abstract will not be allowed.
- All abstracts will be peer reviewed by the Scientific Committee, which reserves the right to accept or reject abstracts for inclusion in the program.
- Presenting author has to standby the poster for Q&A.
- There will be an award for the Best Poster and the Best Free Paper for Oral Presentation.
